Bylaws of the Board

Organization

The organizational framework of the Waterford Board of Education as established through Home Rule actions includes:

- 1. An elected Board of Education consisting of nine members, no more than six of whom may be from one political party
- 2. Terms of office of all members of the Board of Education shall be four (4) years, and elections held biennially. At the 1995 biennial election, and at each four year interval thereafter, five members shall be elected; at the 1997 biennial election, and at each four year interval thereafter, four members shall be elected.

Under State law, the First Selectman is an ex-officio member of the Board.

Legally, a Board-of Education derives its authority from the State. However, by custom and tradition, a local school board has responsibilities to the local citizenry it serves and, by ethics, to the education profession.
